Albany State University	Yes	\$ 15,676,053	\$ 15,676,053	9,900	9,846	<p>Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), requires Albany State University (ASU) will make financial aid grants to students (including students exclusively enrolled in distance education), which may be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency cost that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care, (including mental health care) and childcare.</p> <p>ASU retains discretion to determine the amount of each individual emergency financial aid grant consistent with all applicable laws including non-discrimination laws. ASU will prioritize grants to students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants. However, students do not need to be Pell recipients or students who are eligible for Pell grants in order to receive a financial aid grant. ASU is required to prioritize grants to students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants. However, students do not need to be Pell Grant recipients or eligible for Pell Grants in order to receive a grant through HEERF. Dual Enrolled students and Alien Residents are not eligible to receive these funds.</p> <p>ASU will use each student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC), as determined by the U.S. Department of Education using the 2020-2021 FAFSA, to award the emergency grant based on each student's socioeconomic circumstance. The award amounts are determined by tiers not to exceed the allotted HEERF grant award amount.</p> <p>Where can students find their Expected Family Contribution (EFC)? Each student's EFC can be found on their Institutional Student Information Record or their Banner Web Self-Service account.</p> <p>When will students receive the HEERF Grant? Students have an option to apply the award directly to their account balance and if the account has a credit balance a refund will be issued or the award can be issued directly as a refund.
