ASU Senior Policy

The senior admission policy at Albany State is intended for undergraduates who have earned credit hours 90 or greater with a minimum cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher. Seniors who are interested in this option are advised to meet with their undergraduate Academic Advisor and the appropriate academic program Coordinator prior to completing this request for graduate credit registration for senior undergraduate students form.

Seniors must apply/request and be approved before being permitted to take these graduate courses.

Seniors are allowed to take graduate courses while still remaining as undergraduate students.

Seniors must have earned (90) credit hours or higher toward graduation before being approved to take graduate courses

Seniors must initiate a request by completing the request for graduate credit registration for senior undergraduate students form.

Seniors must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

The approved seniors are limited to a maximum course load of sixteen (16) credit hours (graduate and undergraduate) per semester

Seniors may not take more than (6) graduate credit hours per semester. A limit of nine graduate credits may be earned prior to formal admission as a graduate student.

Under this program credits earned are for graduate credits, separate from the undergraduate credits earned for degree, and will not be calculated in the student's undergraduate credit and grade point total. Also credits earned under this program constitute a permanent graduate – level record and can be transferred to other accredited institutions.

Approved seniors taking graduate courses are governed by the regulations for undergraduate students at Albany State University.
