The JEP is a six-week intensive multifaceted university review and preparatory program for college juniors and seniors interested in health careers.

Goals:

- To improve test-taking skills on standardized test.
- To provide skills for facilitation and acceptance into a health professions school.
- To facilitate financial aid awards in the pursuit of a health professions.

Eligibility:

- Be a student at Albany State University or another post secondary institution.
- Be an American citizen or a permanent resident of the U.S.
- Completed a minimum of 60 semester hours.
- Completed basic coursework in general and organic chemistry, genetics or cell/molecular biology or physiology.
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or better (on a 4.0 scale)
- Be economically and/ or educationally disadvantaged

Curriculum:

- Intensive academic preparation for MCAT, DAT, VCAT, PCAT, GRE.
- Workshops: Mock Admission Interviews, health professions school applications, financial aid, health careers.
