- POSITION:** Instructor/Assistant Professor of Reading
- EFFECTIVE DATE:** August 2009
- SALARY:** Negotiable
- AREA OF SPECIALIZATION:** Reading
- QUALIFICATION:** Applicants for position must have a minimum of Master's Degree in Reading or Reading Education. College teaching in developmental education is preferred. Evidence of scholarly, professional activities, i.e. grant writing and other external funding opportunities, publishing and research are required.
- MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:** The individual accepting this position will teach pre-freshman level reading courses in the Center for Excellence in Teaching, Learning and Advising-Learning Support Unit with an average teaching load of twelve hours per semester, provide academic advisement for students in the department, serve on departmental and college-wide committees, participate in college functions and assume other duties as assigned.
- THE INSTITUTION:** Albany State University is a fully accredited unit of the University System of Georgia. The Learning Support unit in the Center for Excellence currently has seven faculty members who provide instruction in pre-freshman level mathematics, reading and reading courses.
- Faculty members receive all benefits provided by the University System, including hospital and major medical insurance, group life insurance and participation in the Georgia Teachers' Retirement System, Optional Retirement Plan and Social Security.
