Electronic Databases

Academic Search Premier (ASP) 1975—ASP scholarly Collection offers information in nearly every area of academic study including Medical sciences, computer sciences, engineering, physics, chemistry, language and linguistics, arts & literature, ethnic studies, and many more. ASP provides full text for nearly 4,650 serials, including full text for more than 3600 peer reviewed titles as far back as 1975.

Applied Social Sciences Index and Abstracts (ASSIA)—This is an index to articles on health, social services, psychology, sociology, economics, politics, race relations and education.

CSA Social Sciences Collection—The CSA Social Sciences Collection simultaneously search all databases in the Social Sciences i.e. ASSIA, ERIC, PAIS International, MEDLINE, Social Services Abstracts, and Sociological Abstracts.

ERIC (at Ebscohost) Educational Resources Information Center—Educational Resources Information Center, database covers all aspects of education and educational research, includes both abstracts of published and unpublished sources on thousands of educational topics. All subject areas include Psychology, Recreation and Sport, Social Sciences, and Teachers.

FirstGOV.gov search (<http://firstgovsearch.gov/>)—FirstGov.gov, the official U.S. gateway to all government information, is the catalyst for a growing electronic government. This ever-growing Collection of topical and customer-focused links connects you to millions of web pages—from the federal government, local and tribal governments and to foreign nations around the world.

JSTOR—JSTOR is an archive of scanned images of journal issues that offers both multidisciplinary and discipline-specific collections. It covers topics in the Arts & Sciences Collection, the General Collection and the Biological Sciences.

LexisNexis Academic (dates of coverage varies with the publication)—It contains approximately 5,000 publications, virtually all include full text. The types of publications include: newspapers, legal news, general interest magazines, medical journals, trade publications, government publications (such as

the Federal case law, U.S. Code, Code of Federal Regulations, Congressional Testimony, etc.), law reviews, and reference works.

National Library of Medicine (NLM)—The National Library of Medicine (NLM), on the campus of the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland, is the world's largest medical library. The Library collects materials and provides information and research services in all areas of biomedicine and health care. (www.nlm.nih.gov)

Research Library 1986—Subject categories in this database include Law and Criminology, Medicine, Medicine and Health Sciences, Biology, Books and Book Reviews, Chemistry and Physics, General and Multi-Subject, News, Nursing and Allied Health, Sociology, Social Sciences, and many others.

SocIndex with Full-text 1985—Features more than 1,300,000 records with subject headings from a 15,600 term sociology-specific Thesaurus. This database also contains abstracts for more than 620 "core" coverage journals dating back to 1895. SocIndex with Full Text offers coverage from all sub-disciplines of sociology, including criminology, criminal justice, cultural sociology, demography, economic development, ethnic & racial studies, rural sociology, social psychology, social structure, social work, sociological theory, sociology of education, substance abuse, urban studies, violence, welfare, and many others.
