Sponsored Funding: Overall Summary and Highlights, 2018-2019

This report covers FY 2019, the period from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. It documents the sponsored programs activity by the institution with sections that highlights activity by units, departments and principal investigators. Graphs and tables are included to show funding and submission trends as well as a breakdown on sources and types of funding and funded activities.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS SUBMISSIONS

Albany State University submitted 33 proposals, with a total funding request of \$13,808,176 in FY2019. This compares with 39 proposals and \$21,875,012 submitted in FY 2018. These proposals involved forty two (42) faculty and staff, in roles of Principal Investigator or Co-Principal Investigator.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS AWARDS

Albany State University received a total of 30 grants and contracts awards in FY 2019 compared to 25 awards in FY 2018. In FY 2019, the total dollar amount received was \$ 8,544,790 compared to \$10,034,151 in FY 2018, which represents a 15% decrease in the amount of funding received. Thirty (30) faculty and staff were involved as Principal Investigators or Co-Principal Investigators, of which seven (7) were first time recipients or had not received funding within the past 5 years.

Funding Sources: From the sponsored funding received, 47% was from federal agencies, 43% was from state, and the remaining 10% was from other sources including private foundations and corporations.

Funding Mechanisms: Funding was primarily grants, 77%, with 17% contracts, and 6% with cooperative agreements.

Funded Categories: From the funding received, 17% for research, 25% was for education (curriculum/instruction), and 58% focused on community engagement/service projects.

Indirect Funds: From the funding received, a total of \$428,097 in indirect funds was awarded to the institution during FY 2019.








Grants and Contracts: Awards by Sponsor, 2018-2019

FY 2019: Awards by Sponsor (Federal, State, Other)










Grants and Contracts: Awards by Federal Funders, 2018-2019

FY 2019: Awards by Federal Funders




Percentage of Funding by Federal Agency, 2018-2019






Grants and Contracts: Awards by Type, 2018-2019

Percentage of Funding by Type, 2018-2019







Grants and Contracts: Awards by Category: 2018-2019



ASU 10 Year Funding Trend, 2009-2019








