Sponsored Funding: Overall Summary and Highlights, 2019-2020

This report covers FY 2020, the period from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. It documents the sponsored programs activity by the institution with sections that highlights activity by units, departments and principal investigators. Graphs and tables are included to show funding and submission trends as well as a breakdown on sources and types of funding and funded activities.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS SUBMISSIONS

Albany State University submitted 43 proposals, with a total funding request of \$31,886,718 in FY2020. This compares with 39 proposals and \$13,808,176 submitted in FY2019 a 30% increase in submissions compared to previous fiscal year. These proposals involved thirty nine (39) faculty and staff, in roles of Principal Investigator or Co-Principal Investigator.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS AWARDS

Albany State University received a total of 23 grants and contracts awards in FY 2020 compared to 30 awards in FY 2019, a 23.3% decline in the number of awards. In FY 2020, the total dollar amount received was \$ 4,999,728 compared to \$ 8,544,790 in FY 2019, which represents a 41 % decrease in the amount of funding received. Twenty three (23) faculty and staff were involved as Principal Investigators or Co-Principal Investigators, of which three (3) were first time recipients or had not received funding within the past 5 years.

Funding Sources: From the sponsored funding received, 34% was from federal agencies, 58% was from state, and the remaining 8% was from other sources including private foundations and corporations.

Funding Mechanisms: Funding vehicle were grants, 35%with 65% contracts, and 0% with cooperative agreements. The number of subawards/subcontracts have increased from 17% to 65% compared to last fiscal year.

Funded Categories: From the funding received, 25% for research, 19% was for education projects (curriculum/instruction), 45% focused on community engagement/service projects, 2% on student support services and 9% on workforce development (scholarships and student training.

Indirect Funds: From the funding received, a total of \$405,205 in indirect funds was awarded to the institution during FY 2020.








Grants and Contracts: Awards by Sponsor, 2019-2020

Percentage of Funding by Sponsor, 2019-2020






Grants and Contracts: Awards by Federal Funders, 2019-2020

FY 2020: Awards by Federal Funders





Percentage of Funding by Federal Agency, 2019-2020





Grants and Contracts: Awards by Type, 2019-2020









Grants and Contracts: Awards by Category: 2019-2020



ASU 10 Year Funding Trend, 2011-2020




