Sponsored Funding: Overall Summary and Highlights, 2017-2018

This report covers FY 2018, the period from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018. It documents the sponsored programs activity by the institution with sections that highlights activity by units, departments and principal investigators. Graphs and tables are included to show funding and submission trends as well as a breakdown on sources and types of funding and funded activities.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS SUBMISSIONS

Albany State University submitted 39 proposals, with a total funding request of \$21,875,012 in FY2018. This compares with 52 proposals and \$22,528,602 submitted in FY 2017. These proposals involved thirty seven (37) faculty and staff, in roles of Principal Investigator.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS AWARDS

Albany State University received a total of 25 grants and contracts awards in FY 2018 compared to 30 awards in FY 2017. In FY 2018, the total dollar amount received was \$10,034,151 compared to \$7,919,712 in FY 2017, which represents a 27% increase in the amount of funding received. Twenty two (22) faculty and staff were involved as Principal Investigators or Co-Principal Investigators, of which five (5) were first time recipients or had not received funding within the past 5 years.

Funding Sources: From the sponsored funding received, 15% was from federal agencies, 37% was from state, and the remaining 48% was from other sources including private foundations and corporations.

Funding Mechanisms: Funding was primarily grants, 92%, with 8% contracts.

Funded Categories: From the funding received, 4% was for capacity building, 44% for research, 25% was for education (curriculum/instruction), and 27% focused on community engagement/service projects.

Indirect Funds: From the funding received, a total of \$666,824 in indirect funds was awarded to the institution during FY 2018.

TITLE III FUNDING

Albany State University received a total of \$4,332,052 in Title III Funding.










Grants and Contracts: Awards by Sponsor, 2017-2018

FY 2018: Awards by Sponsor (Federal, State, Other)









FY 2018: Awards by Type (Contract, Cooperative Agreement, Grant)




Percentage of Funding by Type, 2017-2018






Grants and Contracts: Awards by Category: 2017-2018



ASU 10 Year Funding Trend, 2009-2018








