Dear Child Care Professionals of Georgia:

You've probably heard by now that DECAL is revising the Quality Rated program. This is the first major revision since the program was established in 2012, and it presents an opportunity for us to reaffirm the core child care practices that help children grow, thrive, and succeed. Our hope is that the redesign of the rating process will also make the system more supportive and easier for providers to navigate.



When we at DECAL talk about high-quality child care, we're talking about the quality of child care environments that foster strong, positive relationships between young children and their classroom teachers, the other adults they interact with, and their peers. This understanding is shared across all DECAL programs—CAPS, CCS, Instructional Supports,

Professional Development, Georgia's Pre-K, and Quality Rated.

Children's interactions with caregivers who are nurturing, supportive, and responsive to their needs and interests are the foundation of high-quality early care and learning, and this won't change with the new system.

The changes we will make with the new Quality Rated program are based in large measure on your feedback. Last year we collected extensive data from providers and other stakeholders about what it's like for you to complete the rating process. One of the things we heard from many providers is that the formal ERS observations can be stressful for classroom teachers and students. And therefore the ratings may not fully capture the quality of your work with children.

It is our goal for the new system to put you, the provider, in charge of a cycle of continuous quality improvement. You will have more options in the rating process, and we hope to include resources for a program improvement planning team. It is our plan to create a new structure that will make the formal observations more predictable and less stressful.

We will be soliciting feedback from providers and other stakeholders throughout the design and implementation of the new system. We held a webinar in May and fielded a stakeholder survey afterward. We are in the process of analyzing that feedback now, and we plan to hold another webinar later this year to update you on our progress.

We're all excited about creating a new system that works better for everyone, and we look forward to sharing it with you.

Qualities to Look for When Hiring a New Teacher

We all know how hard it is today to find quality staff. We tend to hire solely based on education or experience, or even just availability. But maybe we need to stop and take the time to read the people we are interviewing. When setting out to interview for new teachers for your program, try to look for the following qualities:

Empathy – Teachers and educators understand the moods and emotional highs and lows of infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. They know when a hug or high-five is needed.

Encouragement – They don't rely on Jedi mind tricks but rather words of encouragement to get children to try something new.

Patience – Early childhood educators know young children may need to be reminded multiple times to do something, how to do it, or not to do it at all. They can repeat themselves with a smile on their face every time.

Mastery of Time – On the flip side, early childhood educators are masters of time. They know how to handle toddlers and preschoolers running in different directions and how to stick to a schedule. They're masters at getting children to transition or move on to the next activity quickly and with ease.

Creativity – Teachers can make anything out of everyday items. There's nothing they can't do with glue, scissors, and some <u>Pinterest inspiration</u>. Want to see some of the fun things kids get to do at our YMCA child care programs? Get a glimpse of your child's day on our <u>Twitter</u> and <u>Instagram</u> feeds.

Fearlessness - Young children often find bugs, insects, and other creepy crawlies fascinating and teachers aren't afraid to get up close and personal with them even though inside, they're saying something completely opposite.

Transformation – Dramatic play is a big part of many early childhood education curriculums. Early childhood educators have no hang ups about getting into character and can transform into another person, animal, or object in a matter of seconds.

Adaptability – Every day is different with a classroom of infants, toddlers, or preschoolers; early childhood educators can adapt to children's interests easily with their plans B, C, D, E, F, and sometimes G.




