PROFILE OF AN ACTIVE SHOOTER

 An Active Shooter is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined populated area, typically through the use of firearms.

COPING WITH AN ACTIVE SHOOTER SITUATION

- Be aware of your environment and any possible dangers.
- Take note of the two nearest exits in any facility you visit. If you are in an office, stay there and secure the door.

HOW TO RESPOND WHEN LAW ENFORCEMENT ARRIVES

- Remain calm and follow instructions.
- Put down any items in your hands (i.e. bags, jackets).
- Raise hands and spread fingers.
- Avoid quick movements toward officers such as holding onto them for safety.
- Avoid pointing, screaming, or yelling.
- Do not stop to ask officers for help or direction when evacuating.

CALL 9-1-1 WHEN IT IS SAFE TO DO SO.

HOW TO RESPOND TO AN ACTIVE SHOOTER SITUATION

1. EVACUATE:

Have an escape route and plan in mind. Leave your belongings behind. Keep your hands visible.

2. HIDE OUT:

Hide in an area out of the shooter's view. Block entry to your hiding place and lock the doors. Silence your cell phone and/or pager.

3. TAKE ACTION:

Call 9-1-1 before family and friends. Communicate via text message if possible.
