### CYBERBULLYING PREVENTION AND REPORTING

## **Cyberbullying:**

Cyberbullying is bullying that occurs through use of electronic technology such as cell phones, computers, tablets, which include social media sites, text messages, chat, twitter, and websites.

## **Effects of Cyberbullying:**

Cyberbullying results in youth who are more likely to exhibit the following behaviors:

- \* Use alcohol and drugs.
- \* Unwilling to attend school and receive poor grades in school.
- \* Experience bullying directly with another person.
- \* Exhibit lower self-esteem and experience more health issues.

#### **Prevention of Cyberbullying:**

- \* Refrain from sharing your Identification with others. Do not give your password to others.
- \* Refrain from posting information or pictures on-line that should not be shared with others.

# **Report Cyberbullying:**

- \* If you feel that you are a victim, please contact your local Police Department by phone: 911.
- \* Report Cyberbullying immediately to Law Enforcement, Online Service Providers, and Schools.
- \* Do not respond to Cyberbullying messages.
- \* Keep evidence of Cyberbullying such as a record of the date, time, and description of the Cyberbullying occurrence.
- \* Electronically block the person who is Cyberbullying.

## Georgia Law regarding Bullying:

1999 Georgia Laws, H.B. 84, Chap. 282 (O.C.G.A. § 20-2-751.4 and O.C.G.A. § 20-2-751.5.)

Requires the implementation of a character education program at all grade levels that is to include methods of discouraging bullying and violent acts against fellow students. 2010 - Georgia Updates with SB 250.
