What is Transition and why is it important?

Description

A working definition of transition should be planned and intentional including when the process should begin for a child and include a sample written plan of transition into kindergarten.

Social Emotional Ready

Description

Typical constraints include: tantrums, crying, defiance, focusing problems, aggressive behaviors, impulsiveness, vision or hearing loss, and other special needs.
