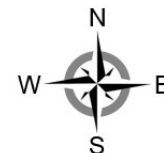

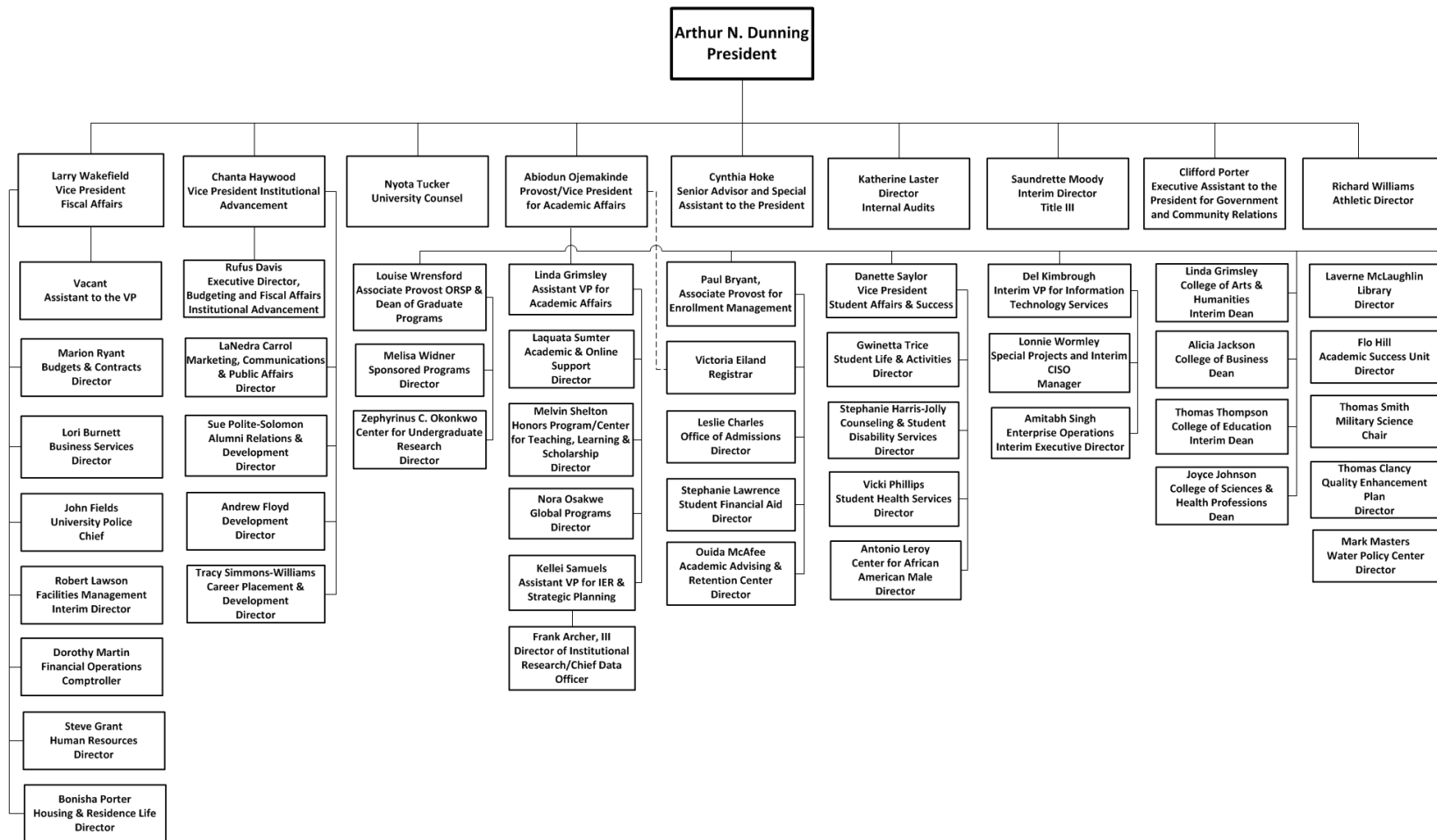
Albany State University Mission (continued)

U.S. News & World Report released this year's list of top ranked colleges and universities. Albany State University is listed among the top Historically Black Colleges and Universities in the nation. Previously unranked, ASU made the cut at number 15 among all public HBCUs nationally. According to the rankings released today, ASU pulled ahead of Georgia's public HBCUs Fort Valley State University and Savannah State University. The rankings are based on graduation and retention rates, peer assessments, the student to faculty ratio, admission test scores, the strength of the faculty and alumni giving, among other measures of academic excellence.

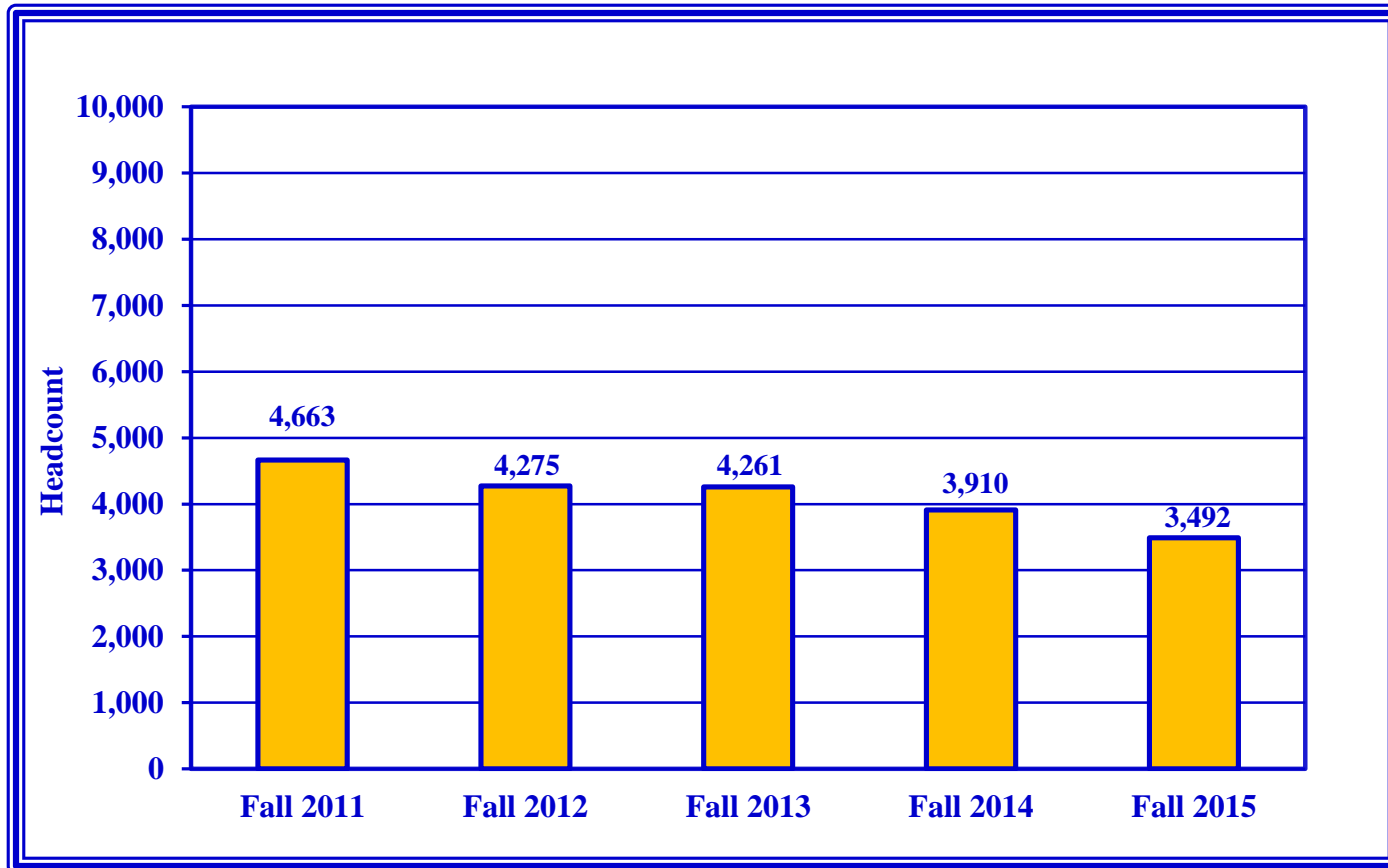

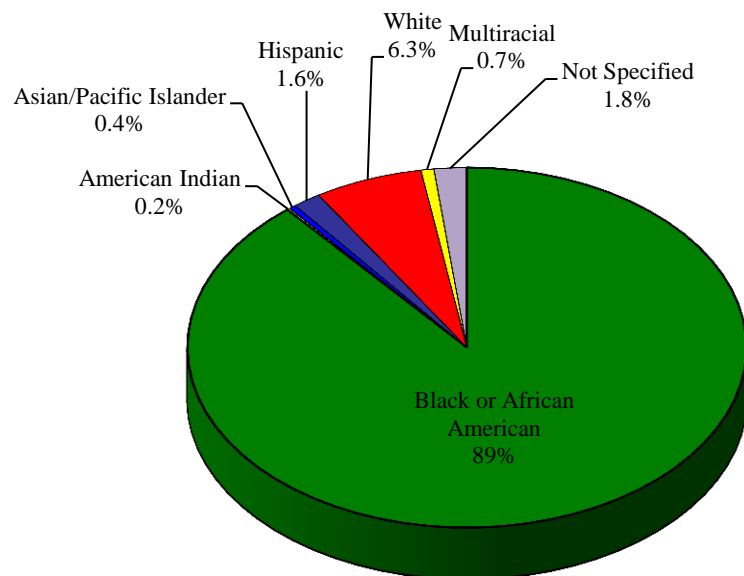

Total Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

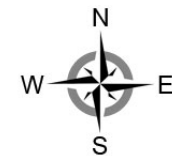
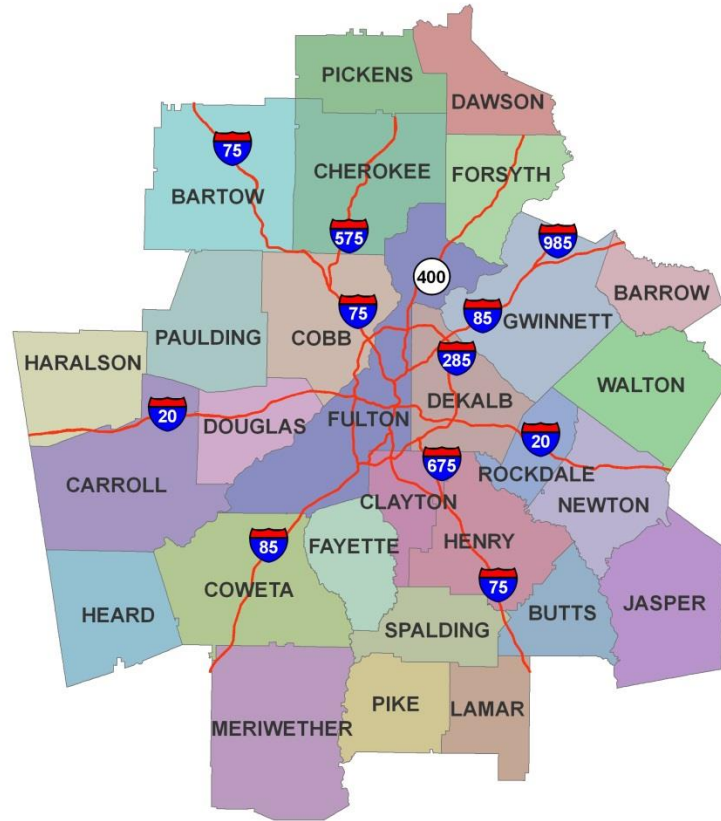

Fall 2015 Enrollment by Metro Atlanta Counties

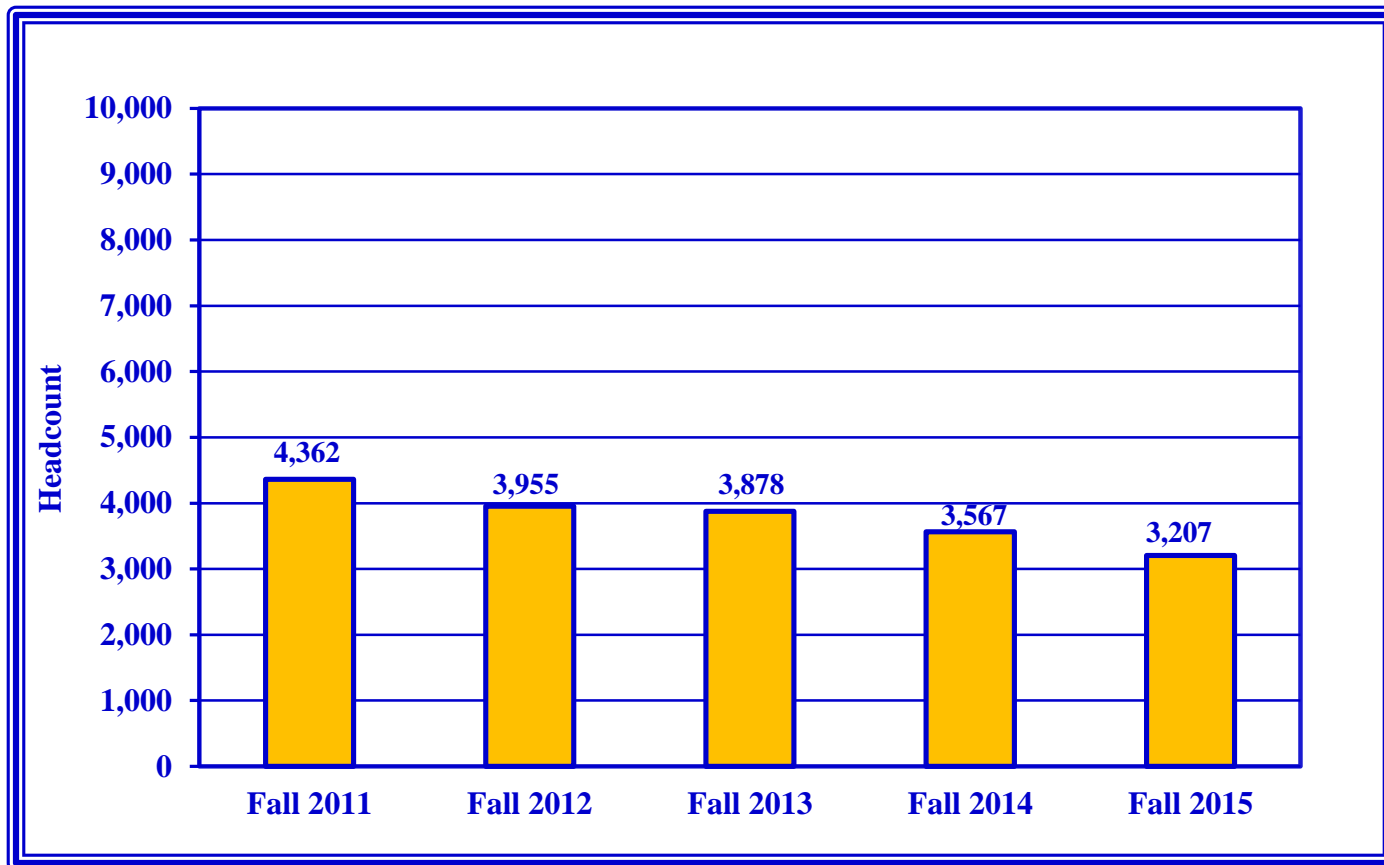

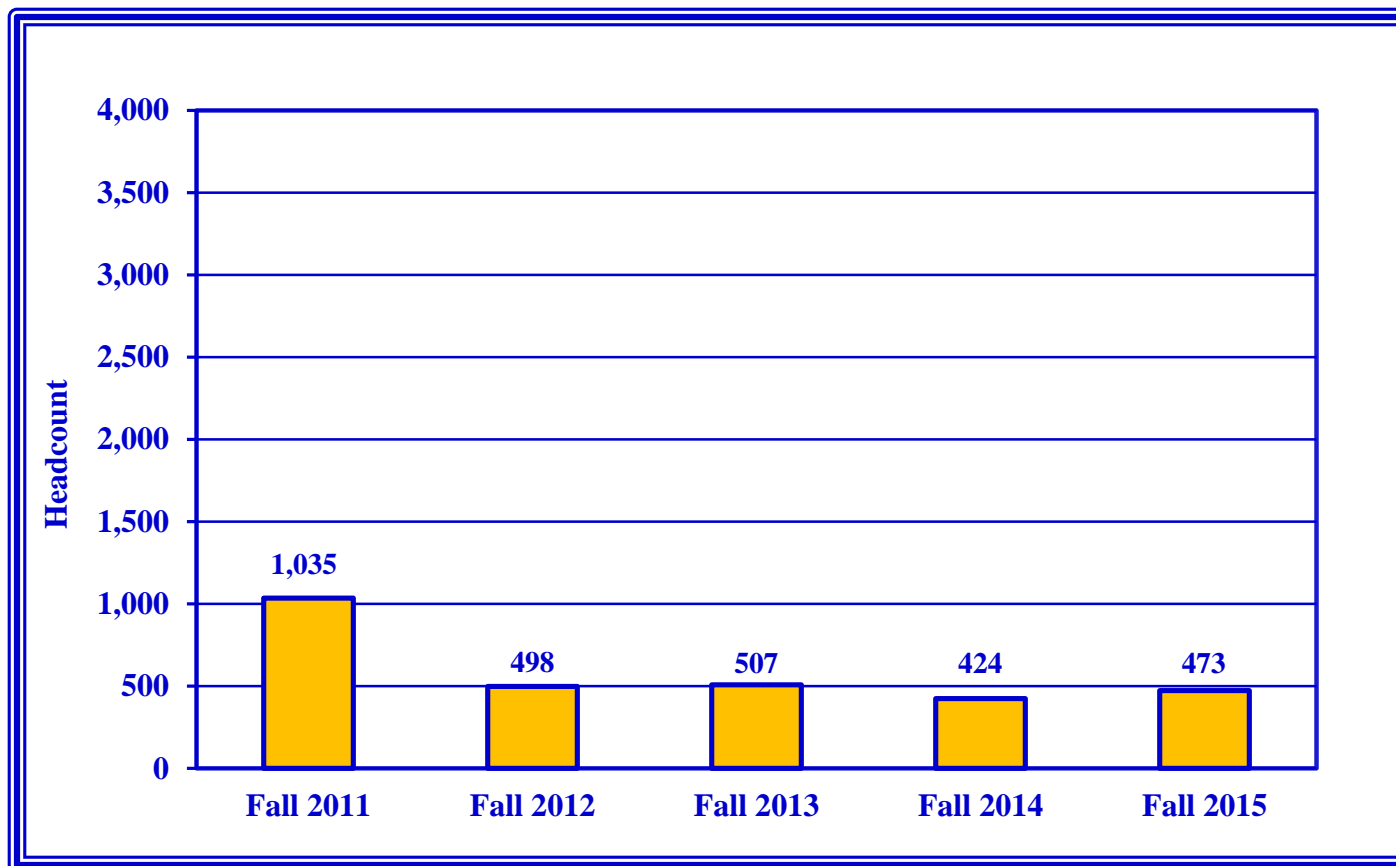
Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment Five Year Comparison

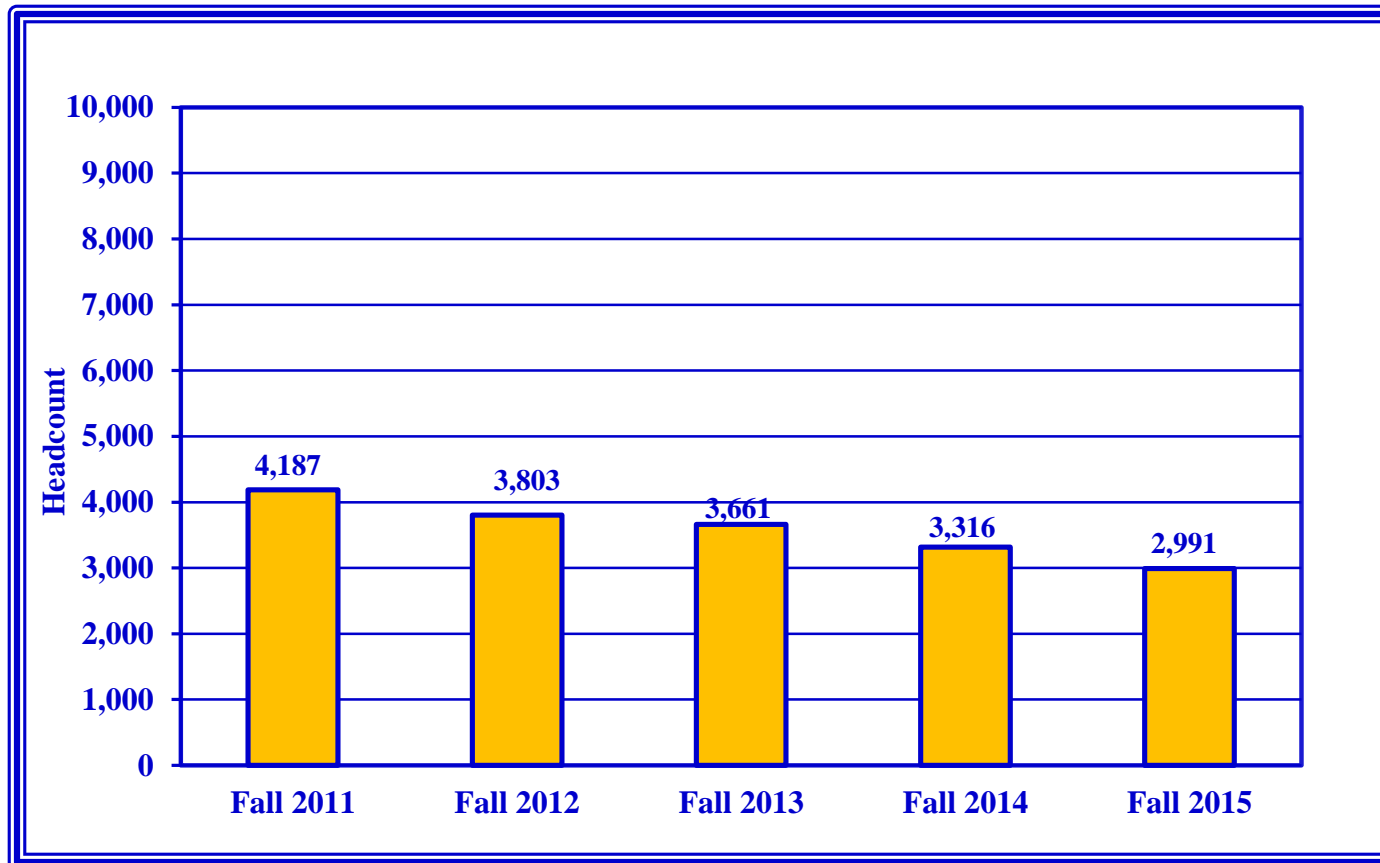
First-Time Full-Time Freshmen Enrollment Five Year Comparison

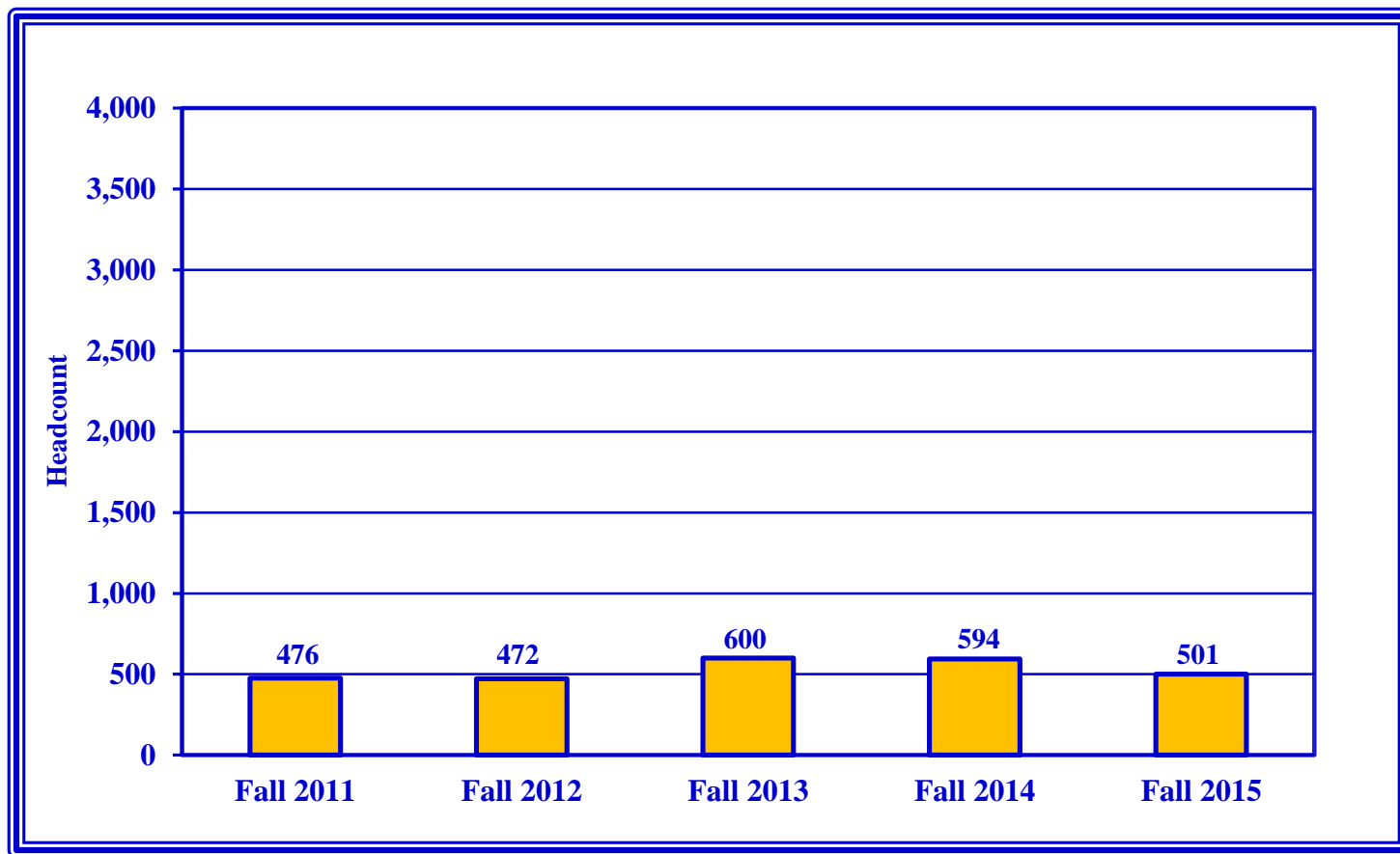
Undergraduate Enrollment Five Year Comparison

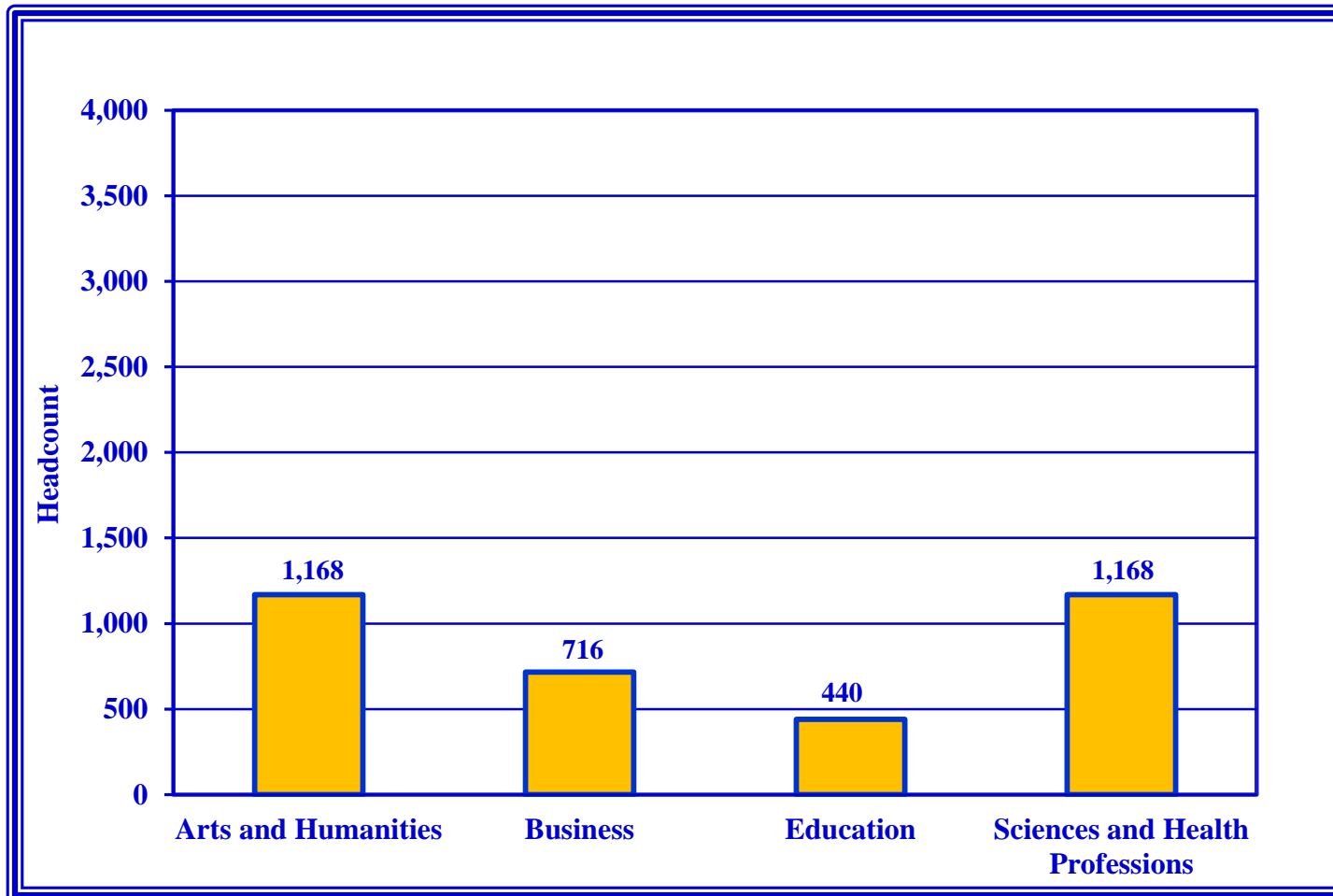
Graduate Enrollment Five Year Comparison

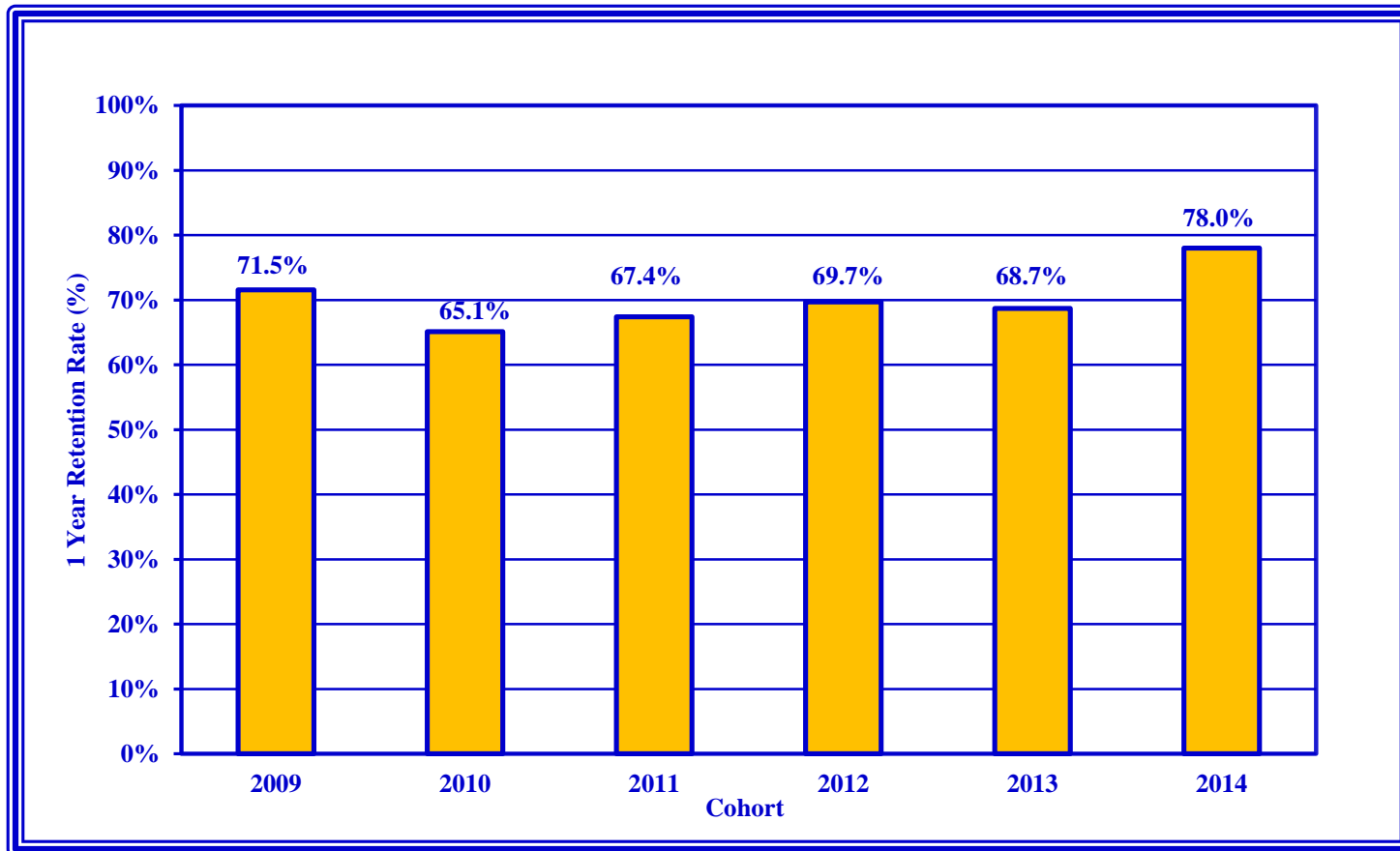
Fall 2015 Total Enrollment by Colleges

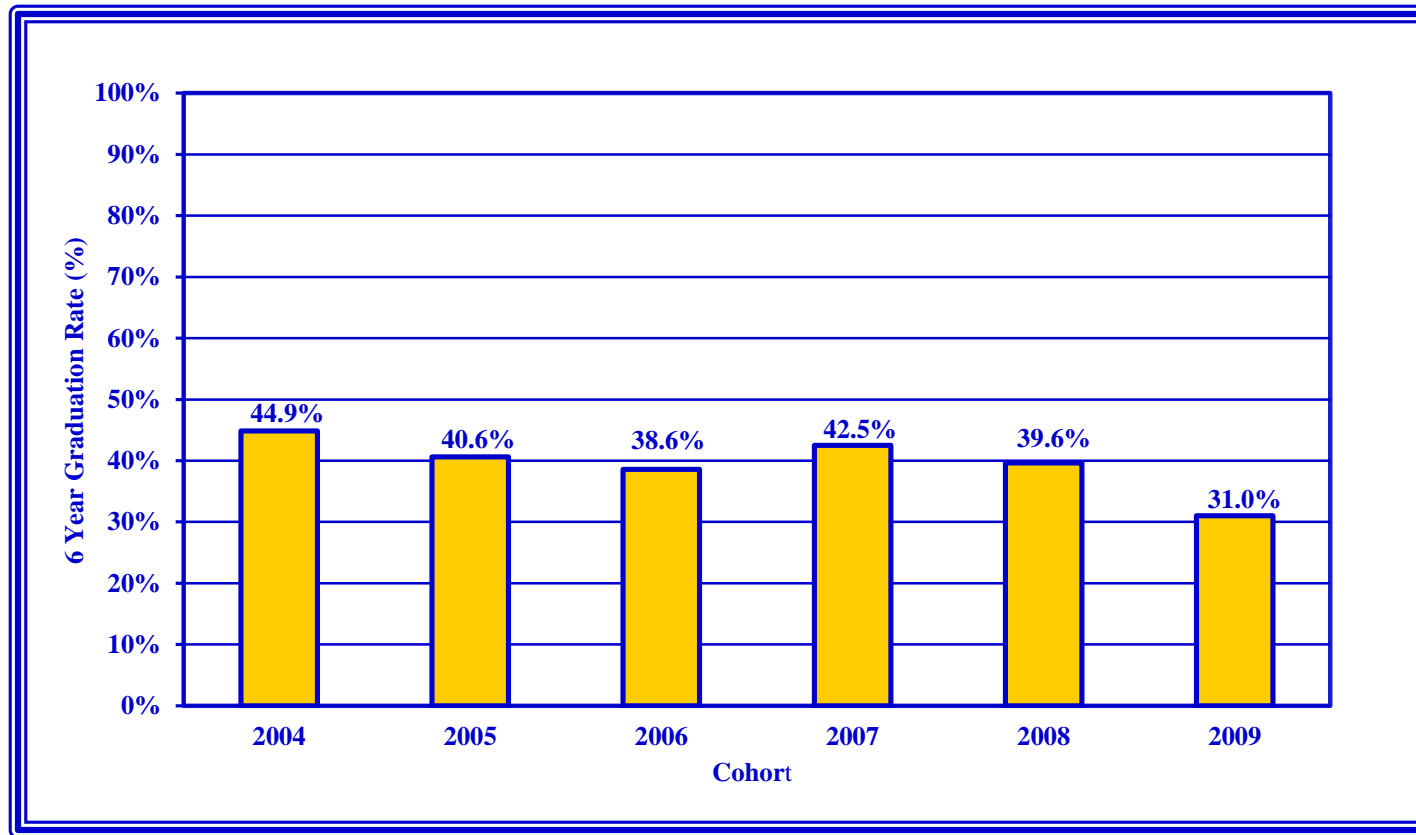

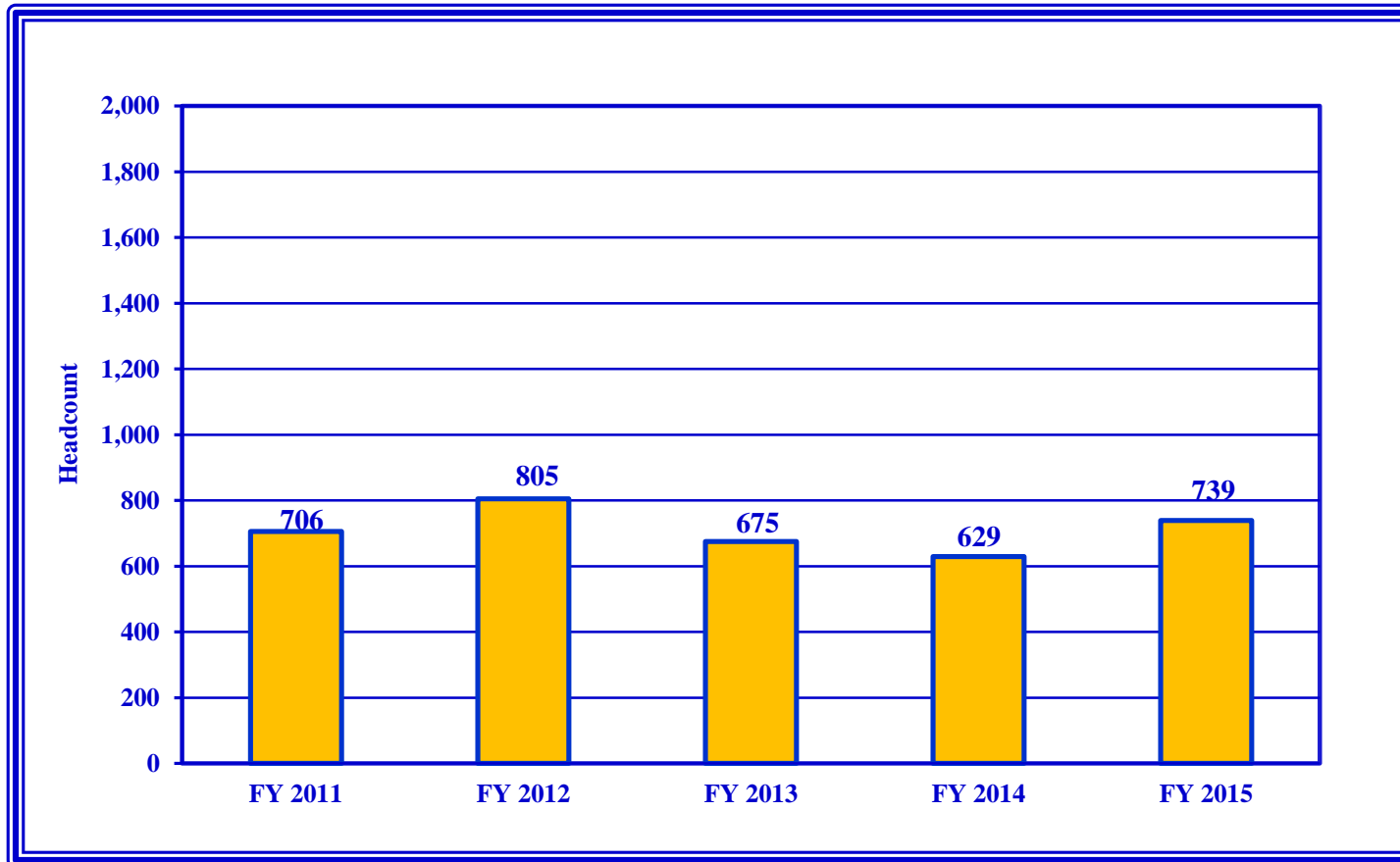

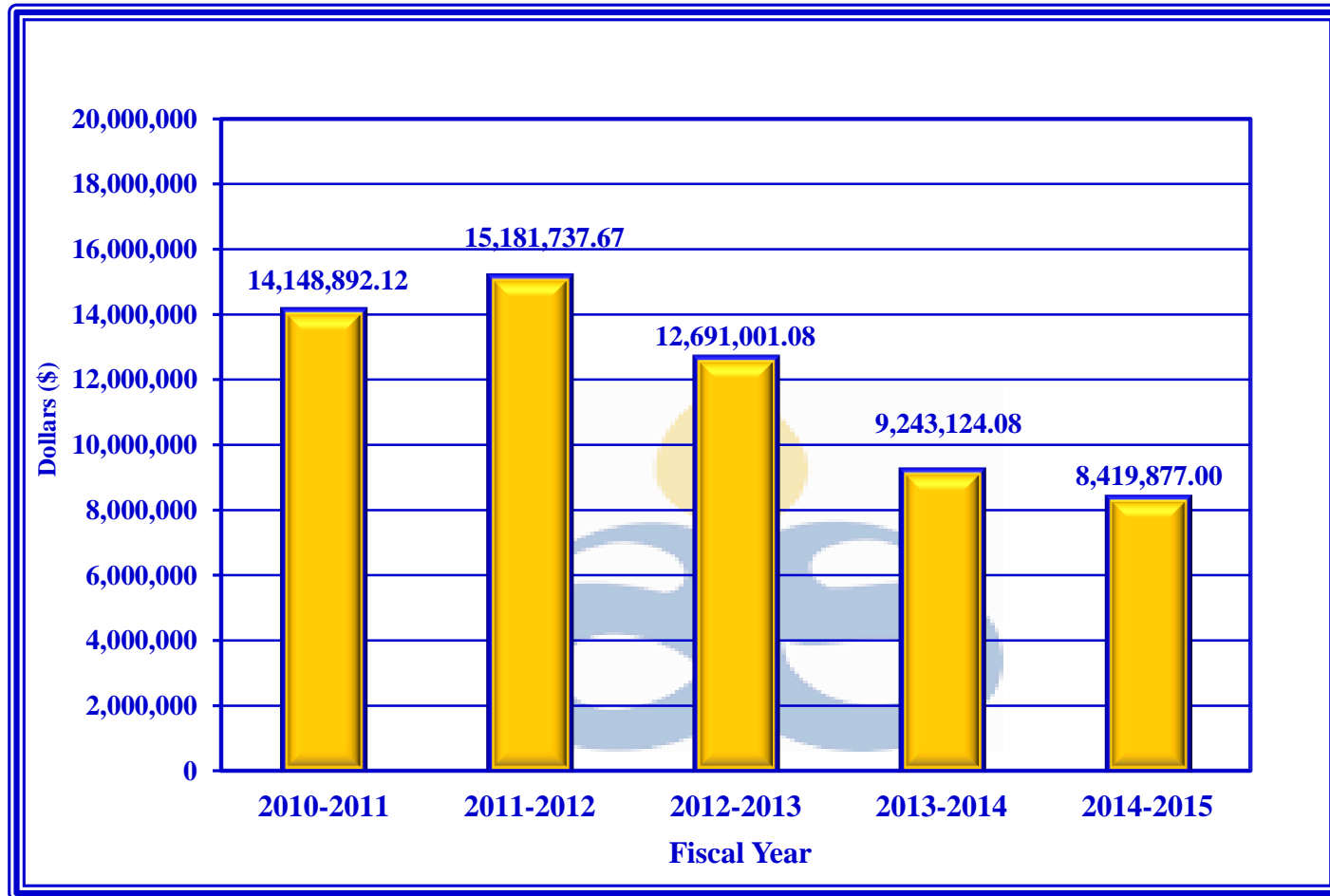
