Program Costs

The program package is **\$4,029** and includes:

- Round trip flight tickets to the Dominican Republic (DR)
- Lodging, most meals, and insurance
- Transportation while in the DR
- And several cultural excursions to some of DR's most famous attractions!

Cost does not include ASU tuition, passport, additional expenses, or spending money.

Scheduled Payments

Application fees- \$100 + \$400 deposit (non-refundable) due by November 30th .

- **First installment: \$1,765 due 1/15/16**
- **Final payment: \$1,764 due 3/1/16**
- **ASU Tuition: Approximately \$1206 (6 credits)—due in May 2016 before travel**

Courses:

Survey of Spanish American Literature II (SPAN 4002),

3 credit hours: This course will focus on Spanish Literature from Modernism to the contemporary period. It will also outline how Spanish-American society was changing as these centuries drew to a close, Spanish-American Literature within the context of the literary movements, and illustrate how authors develop distinctive styles by sampling various works, including the Dominican authors.

Advanced Grammar (SPAN 3420)

3 credit hours: This course is designed for advanced students who are willing to develop and enhance their knowledge in Spanish Grammar by learning more complex aspects of Spanish Grammar and effective writing skills. Students will engage in both informal and formal (“spontaneous” and “reflective”) writing and will practice the forms and processes of writing used in professions related to the Spanish language field, and creative writing in Spanish. Students will receive explicit instructions for each writing assignment, as well as a detailed scoring guide, editing guides and explanation of scores. In class activities will include communicative activities in applying grammar to speaking skills, and may involve debates about Dominican custom and culture, presentations, and other interactive activities.

Hispanic Culture (SPAN 2220)

3 credit hours: This course is an introduction to the history and cultures of the nations that compose the Latin American continent today, from pre-Columbian times to present. Throughout the course, we will explore the politics, social structures, traditions, culture, artistic movements and history of Latin America. The scope of the course covers the main pre-Columbian civilizations, the time of the Spanish discovery and colonization period along the entire continent as well as the start of new nationalities and the projection of them into the present and last century.

**Students enrolled in Study Abroad Programs must take a minimum of 6 credits*

***Advanced language courses available for students depending on their language experience.*
