ASU 's Department of Nursing will host a four week study abroad program at The Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Medical College & Memorial Mission Hospital of south India. The institution, located in the Karakonam village of the Thiruvananthapuram District of the State of Kerala, has provided medical care and education for its small community for almost 20 years. Students in this program will get to experience enhanced clinical opportunities to gain a greater knowledge of nursing in diverse populations and settings.

Course Information

NURS 2601: Introduction to Geriatric Nursing

This course is designed to enhance the knowledge of nursing students regarding nursing care of the aged client. The course work and clinical objectives will also focus on the multicultural aspects of the aging population. Discussions and assignments will utilize various cultural groups, including their differences and similarities.

NURS 3010/4010: Nursing Externship

This junior/senior year elective course provides the students with an opportunity to interact with one or more hospitalized clients. The experience occurs in the clinical setting under the mentorship of a professional registered nurse at an approved health care agency in the country of India. Students will also have opportunities to interact with the various members of the health care team.

NURS 4240: Community Health

This course is designed to assist the student in acquiring knowledge of the roles and responsibilities of the professional community health nurse. Within this course the student will focus on resources available within the community and have the opportunity to apply skills and concepts of nursing and community health to individuals, families, and the community.
