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Students are required to register for at least 6 credit hours. If you are a transient student, check for equivalent course numbers at your institution. All courses will integrate cultural information from excursions and lectures in the context of the Study Abroad – Trinidad and Tobago program. Students will visit local human service agencies, schools, institutions, witness many events and have close contact with local students and citizens as well as visiting students and citizens from other countries to enhance their study abroad experience. In addition to the registered courses, all students will have classes on the history and culture of Trinidad and Tobago and the social issues/services and challenges that are addressed on a daily basis, taught by UWI faculty.



COURSE TITLES

SOWK 4310: Global Research -This course is an avenue for practical technological skills to be integrated with global issues and is designed to offer students an opportunity to explore and research subjects outside of the traditional classroom setting. The topics and issues selected should be specific to their discipline/major and the final context will include reflections and input from a UWI professor who specializes in the chosen area of research.

SOWK 4460: International Social Welfare Policy and Service Learning – This course introduces students to issues regarding social welfare in a global context to include a range of international problems. In addition to classroom learning, this course is designed to provide students with international onsite academic service learning experiences in the host country. They will have field outings/internships that will allow them to examine the dimensions of social problems (poverty, health care, child-wellbeing, nutrition, violence etc.) and in classroom settings will utilize local, national, and international comparisons.
