M.A.L.E.S. Mentors, formerly known as C.A.A.M., began in 1989 under the direction of the late Dr. Billy C. Black, former President of Albany State University.

Mission: To enhance male students' collegiate experiences at Albany State

University for increased retention, progression, and overall academic success.

Features: Under the Division of Student Affairs and Success, M.A.L.E.S. Mentors aids in the recruitment and retention of male students, facilitates their academic preparation, and collaborates with community partners to ensure that all males meet their full potential. M.A.L.E.S. Mentors emphasizes mentoring programs, and utilizes area based research to maximize student's future success.

People: M.A.L.E.S. Mentors addresses the needs of the University and our twenty-four county service area by providing programs and research data to facilitate area programs in addressing areas such as, college preparation, image, identity, and community leadership.

Accomplishments: M.A.L.E.S. Mentors has hosted nearly 5,000 fifth and sixth grade males from Albany and Southwest Georgia at the Annual Winter Youth Summit. With the creation of the Black Tie Male Scholarship Banquet, M.A.L.E.S. Mentors awarded 24 Albany State University students with scholarships and educational stipends for the 2017 fall semester. Within ASU's service area, M.A.L.E.S. Mentors contributed more than 2,000 community service hours during the 2016-2017 academic year. As a result, M.A.L.E.S. Mentors received the Community Partner Award from the Dougherty County School System (DCSS). In 2013, 38 ninth grade males from four public high schools in Dougherty County were enrolled into the M.A.L.E.S. Mentors mentoring program. In May 2017, 37 out of the 39 DCSS students graduated on time, yielding a 95 percent success rate. Additionally, 85 percent of the DCSS students enrolled in college, joined the military or applied for a trade or certificate program. In 2016, 70 percent of our collegiate males enrolled in M.A.L.E.S. Mentors who attended at least 80 percent of our programs and activities achieved nearly a 3.0 GPA.
