ASU will provide supportive and/or
protective measures and access to
disciplinary proceedings whether or not
you report to law enforcement for a
formal investigation.



You **do not** have to choose a course of
action immediately, but consider
preserving physical evidence via a
SANE exam, within 72 hours, in case
you choose to pursue charges.

Do not shower or bathe. Other possible
physical evidence includes letters,
photos, emails, text messages, clothing,
and bedding.

ASU Cares

If you or someone you know has experienced gender-based violence, please know that support is available and you are not alone. The information in this brochure is designed to help you understand your options and navigate the resources available to you. Whatever you may be feeling, **your safety and well-being are the top priority.** Help is available, and you do not have to face this experience alone.

When you report, ASU will provide you with additional written information about all of your options including how to obtain supportive measures and pursue formal disciplinary and or criminal investigations. You will also receive information on existing counseling, health, mental health, victim advocacy, legal assistance, visa and immigration assistance, student financial aid, and other services.

What is prohibited conduct?

- Sexual Assault
- Sexual Harassment
- Stalking
- Dating Violence
- Domestic Violence

What steps can I take?

If you are in a state of emergency, **call 911.** You do not have to choose a course of action immediately, but consider preserving evidence in case you choose to pursue charges. Possible evidence might be letters, photos, emails, messages, clothing, bedding, etc. **ASU will provide supportive measures and access to disciplinary proceedings whether or not you report to law enforcement.**

How will ASU support me?

The Title IX Compliance Office is responsible for handling sexual misconduct complaints.

The Title IX Coordinator assists persons alleging sexual misconduct in filing their complaints and/or overseeing the step-bystep procedures to be sure that appropriate time frames are met.

Supportive measures will be maintained as confidential to the extent possible and are independent of any law enforcement or disciplinary investigation.

Title IX Coordinator will assist in obtaining:

- Counseling
- Advocacy
- Housing Assistance
- Academic Support
- Disability Services
- Health/Mental Health
- Changes To: Academic, Living, Transportation, & Working Situations

What are my rights in Disciplinary Proceedings?

All University disciplinary proceedings involving reports of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking on or off-campus shall be conducted in a **prompt, fair, and impartial manner**, from the initial investigation through resolution.

A formal complaint may be initiated by contacting the Title IX Coordinator.

A complete copy of the policy and procedures for the appropriate process will be provided to you at that time.

How will ASU protect me?

- ASU protects victims privacy to the highest degree possible.
- Information is only shared as needed to provide *Supportive Measures* or to conduct an investigation.
- Privacy Cannot be Guaranteed if a Report is made to ASU Police
- ASU recognizes and enforces lawful Orders of Protection (e.g., Restraining Order, No Contact, Etc.)
- If You Have an Order of Protection Submit it to ASU Police and/or Title IX Coordinator.

A complaint alleging sexual misconduct may be made by any member of the University community.

Once received, the Title IX Coordinator will determine which type of proceeding will be used for each complaint on a case-by-case basis, taking into consideration criteria including the nature of the reported incident, who is involved, and the context of and/or where it occurred.

The standard of evidence in all University proceedings is the preponderance of the evidence. Upon completion of formal adjudication proceedings, affording due process rights to all parties, sanctions, up to and including suspension, expulsion, and termination may be applied. All parties have the right to an advisor and to a fair and impartial process, the administration of the process is the responsibility of the Title IX Coordinator.
